

# Lowering the Age for Confirmation

Cardinal Seán recently approved a proposal that changes the ordinary age for Confirmation from 10th Grade to 8th Grade in the Archdiocese of Boston, to be implemented over the next 2–3 years. The Archdiocese made this decision in order to:

- Strengthen the participation of young people and their families in their spiritual lives.
- Give ownership of the faith to young people by decreasing the gaps between the Sacraments.
- Increase the role of families in the faith formation of their children.

At St. Ignatius, Candidates prepare for Confirmation over two years. Confirmation I introduces students to the foundational beliefs of the Catholic faith. Confirmation II builds upon those beliefs, encouraging students to claim the faith as their own in the tradition of Ignatian discernment. Per the Archdiocese's guidelines, we will transition to the lower Confirmation age on the following timeline:

## 2024-2025

- Students entering 10th Grade in Fall 2024, who have already completed Confirmation I, will go through Confirmation II, as usual.
- Students entering 8th–9th Grade in Fall 2024 will begin Confirmation I.

## 2025-2026

- Students entering 9th–10th Grade in Fall 2025 will begin Confirmation II.
- Students entering 7th–8th Grade in Fall 2025 will begin Confirmation I.

### 2026–2027 (transition complete)

- Students entering 8th-9th Grade in Fall 2026 will begin Confirmation II.
- Students entering 7th Grade in Fall 2026 will begin Confirmation I.
