


Reflection on the Readings

Racial Justice Committee Reflection

During this month of February, we are given a special gift: an opportunity to reflect on the rich and yet painful history in this country of Black people. We might ask ourselves the question, "How in the face of so much suffering, does a vibrant and rich trust in God survive among those who experience these unique hardships?" In today's Gospel, Simon experiences some level of his own frustration at Jesus's words to lower his nets yet again, after so empty a night of fishing. But he trusts and lowers the nets again. For so many of our sisters and brothers who live lives marginalized in some fashion, this frustration to try yet again must be familiar. And yet, they trust in Jesus as Simon Peter did. How might we join with them as Jesus calls us to do?

Our first reading today from Isaiah presents us with a unique opportunity to respond to the voice of the Lord in our world, particularly this Black History Month. As we encounter injustice of any kind and we hear the Lord saying, "Whom shall I send? Who will go for us?", let us pray that each of us has the courage to respond, "Here I am Lord, send me!" Jesus, give us a clear view of how we might respond to your call this month and beyond.





Dear Fellow Parishioners,

On behalf of the Parish Finance Council, Fr. John, and the staff at St. Ignatius, we are pleased to share with you the Annual Report for the fiscal year ended June 30, 2024.

We are deeply grateful for your financial support of the parish. All the programs and ministries of the parish are supported entirely by you via the donations we receive weekly at Mass and via online giving. As a parish, from a financial standpoint, we are entirely dependent on ourselves, we parishioners.

As you can see from the revenue chart, we are beginning to see renewed growth in revenue, primarily in Collections, driven, we believe, by growing Mass attendance and engagement in our rich faith community. This resulted in a net income in 2024 of \$99,062, which is a reversal from the loss in the previous fiscal year of \$-18,425.* We are very grateful for this upswing.

We very much hope and pray that this trend continues so that we can maintain our multiple ministries while beginning to face in earnest the deferred maintenance of our church building, which has grown over the last couple of decades. We plan to share more details of our financial health with you in the coming months as we develop plans to maintain a healthy trend in revenue and begin to plan and fundraise for the much-needed maintenance of our church. We are confident that as a parish and a spiritual community, we will be able to work together with God's help to continue thriving. Thank you again for your past and future generosity and support.

In Their Footsteps. . . In Their Faith

In Black History Month we recall the courage, hope and faith of Black spirituality! God has always been the source of hope, joy, and peace.

Bilal, The First Muezzin (580–640), an Abyssinian Black man, was born into slavery to parents of African descent. He became the Muslims' first muezzin, the person who calls others to prayer. This voice is a holy voice, a solemn call to communion with God. His story is said to reflect the values of Islam: human equality, kindness, and anti-racism.

Reverend Absalom Jones (1746–1818) was the first African American ordained in the Episcopal Church. Born into slavery, he was once expelled from a church for praying in the white pews. In 1791, he and a friend established a Black church that later became the African Methodist Episcopal Church (AME). Despite enduring persistent racism, his message was the empowering belief that "God is above all."

Sojourner Truth was born Isabella Baunfree (1797–1840). During the height of slavery and oppression, Sojourner Truth was perhaps the most powerful abolitionist in the nation. Formerly enslaved, a women's rights advocate, and an abolitionist, she told in her autobiography of a dramatic vision of Jesus' love. She is the first African American woman to have a statue in the U.S. Capitol building.

Sister Maria Becraft (1805–1833), born to prominent free Black Catholics and educated in private schools, realized that knowledge was essential for Black liberation. "Not Just For Me" was her belief, and she founded a free school for Black children in Washington, D.C. She later joined the Oblate Sisters of Providence, an order founded by and for Black women. In 2017 Georgetown University renamed Remembrance Hall after her, their first building to be named for an African American woman.

Archbishop Desmond Tutu (1931–2021) rose through the hierarchy of the Anglican Church of South Africa, becoming archbishop in 1986. At the height of South Africa's repressive apartheid system, Tutu was awarded the Nobel Peace Prize for his strong belief in and work toward nonviolent solutions. In 1996, he headed the South African Truth and Reconciliation Commission to investigate the abuses of apartheid.

Anointing of the Sick

Saturday, February 15 at the 4pm Mass

To commemorate the World Day of the Sick (February 11, Feast of Our Lady of Lourdes), St. Ignatius will be offering a communal Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick for parishioners next Saturday, February 15, at the 4pm Mass.

The Sacrament, which was previously known as Extreme Unction (the "Last Rites"), was modified in the 1970s in order to extend the healing power of Christ to all manifestations of serious illness, both temporary and chronic. The sacrament is for those who are seriously ill or injured, battling chronic physical or mental conditions, or confronting the debilitating effects of aging.

If you or family members experience a sickness of any sort (physical, mental-psychological, emotional, social, historical), come to this special Mass of Anointing. There will be reserved places for those limited in movement or using wheelchairs, but any Catholic person experiencing serious sickness is invited to this sacrament.


