

Reflection on the Readings

Peace, Justice & Reconciliation Reflection

Today's readings are infused with God's love for his people and his care for those who suffer and are in danger of perishing. God witnesses the affliction of his people in Egypt and hears their cry. He knows they are suffering and acts—he sends Moses to rescue them. In the Gospel, when the owner finds his fig tree unproductive and asks to cut it down, the gardener (God) tries to save the tree by cultivating it. He gives the tree another chance to bear fruit.

The Hebrew people migrated to Egypt fleeing drought and scarcity of food in their land. Their experience of God liberating them from slavery in Egypt leads to many biblical admonitions such as "your God... befriends the alien, feeding and clothing him. So you too must befriend the alien" (Deut. 10:19). Jesus goes further: he identifies himself as an immigrant—"I was a stranger, and you welcomed me" (Mt 25:35)—and he promises the Kingdom to those who do so. Jesus also talks of God being merciful and patient, willing to cultivate our souls when our fruit is found wanting. Are we willing to let God till the ground of our souls so we can produce a better fruit welcoming immigrants?

As we celebrate Oscar Romero's feast this Monday, let's remember that our poor immigrants are like St. Oscar's poor, many of whom had to flee their country to take refuge in ours.

Nutritious Meals Help Children's Growth



Ana Belén and her husband, José, have four children and a baby on the way. They live in a CRS RICE small house in Santa María Chiquimula, Guatemala. Francisco, their 9-year-old son, says his neighborhood is, "a very happy place to live, but sometimes it's also very hard to live here." He is not wrong. In their community, malnutrition affects over half of the population

mainly because people can't afford to put food on the table.

When the COVID-19 pandemic started, José lost his job as a driver. Even after the pandemic, things never went back to normal. Food prices went up and eggs became twice as expensive. The little money they had wasn't enough to buy even the basics. Now the family participates in a Catholic Relief Services project that helps fight hunger in places where people don't have enough food. Through the project, Ana Belén goes every other week to her children's school to receive food such as corn, beans, rice, vegetable oil and eggs. "It made me happy when they started giving me eggs," she says. Ana Belén's family now eats nutritious meals every day and her children receive monthly health check-ups, as part of the project.

As part of their preparation, the catechumens undergo a series of three Scrutinies during Mass on the Third, Fourth, and Fifth Sundays of Lent, which give the Elect a chance to examine themselves and reject whatever may be distancing them from God.

The First Scrutiny on the Third Sunday of Lent emphasizes that Jesus is the living water that satisfies us. God provides water to Moses in the wilderness, and the woman at the well receives living water that will never leave her thirsty. First Scrutiny invites us into a deeper trust in God's ultimate satisfaction of our needs.


